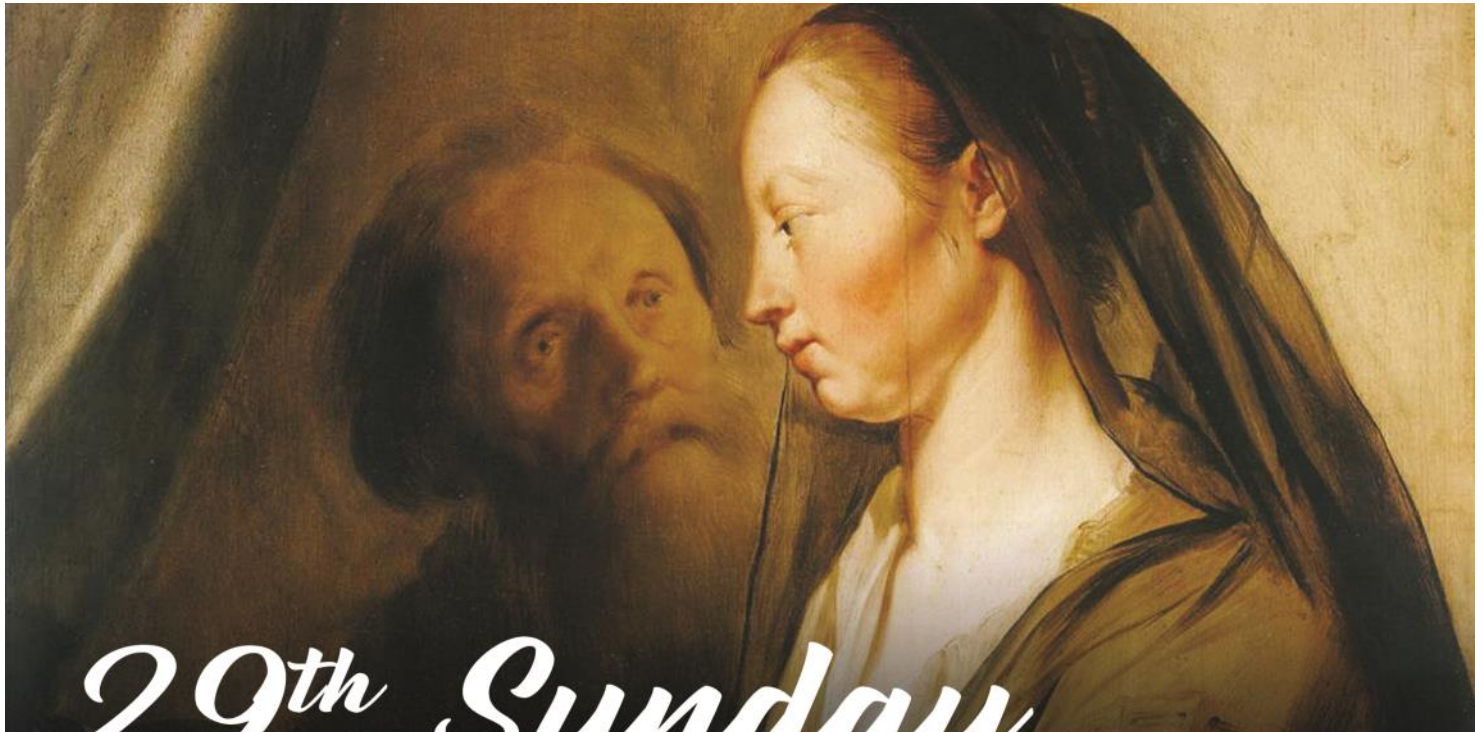

Dear Friends in Christ,

This past week we started the build-back between the parish center and north building. If you remember, we have been working for some time to separate the property into three parcels. This required a physical division between the buildings and we decided to demolish the breezeway overhang between the youth center and north building. So now it is time for the build-back, which includes some work on both sides of the building and a new smaller overhang for the north building. The work should take a few weeks.

I mentioned two weeks ago that Friday penance is still part of the discipline of the Church for Catholics. Here is part of the Pastoral Statement on Penance and Abstinence from the National Conference of Catholic Bishops:

"Gratefully remembering this, Catholic peoples from time immemorial have set apart Friday for special penitential observance by which they gladly suffer with Christ that they may one day be glorified with Him. This is the heart of the tradition of abstinence from meat on Friday where that tradition has been observed in the holy Catholic Church.

Changing circumstances, including economic, dietary, and social elements, have made some of our people feel that the renunciation of the eating of meat is not

always and for everyone the most effective means of practicing penance. Meat was once an exceptional form of food; now it is commonplace.

Accordingly, since the spirit of penance primarily suggests that we discipline ourselves in that which we enjoy most, to many in our day abstinence from meat no longer implies penance, while renunciation of other things would be more penitential. For these and related reasons, the Catholic bishops of the United States, far from downgrading the traditional penitential observance of Friday, and motivated precisely by the desire to give the spirit of penance greater vitality, especially on Fridays, the day that Jesus died, urge our Catholic people henceforth to be guided by the following norms.

Friday itself remains a special day of penitential observance throughout the year, a time when those who seek perfection will be mindful of their personal sins and the sins of mankind which they are called upon to help expiate in union with Christ Crucified. Friday should be in each week something of what Lent is in the entire year. For this reason we urge all to prepare for that weekly Easter that comes with each Sunday by freely making of every Friday a day of self-denial and mortification in prayerful remembrance of the passion of Jesus Christ.

Among the works of voluntary self-denial and personal penance which we especially commend to our people for the future observance of Friday, even though we hereby terminate the traditional law of abstinence binding under pain of sin, as the sole prescribed means of observing Friday, we give first place to abstinence from flesh meat. We do so in the hope that the Catholic community will ordinarily continue to abstain from meat by free choice as formerly we did in obedience to Church law."

I pray that you will take seriously this call to a Friday penance and perhaps discover what would make each Friday a true reminder of what Christ has suffered for us and how we too are called to self-denial.

Also, as Halloween approaches, it is a good time to remind ourselves that while there is great fun in dressing up, we should avoid that which deals with the occult. So while certainly there are many costumes that are appropriate, things dealing with witches, devils, or generally glorifying evil, are not the sort of things that represent the Catholic faith very well. As parents and guardians, this is a place where I encourage you to exercise discernment and prudence with how we celebrate Halloween. It is no easy task.
