

Dear Friends in Christ,

Thank you to all who helped make our Christmas liturgies so beautiful this year, from the preparation of the outdoor altar and nativity scene to the liturgical environment decor to the ministries involved in all the liturgies, especially with music. To all of you many thanks!

A key part of spiritual adoption is realizing the power of Intercessory prayer. We hear in the Catechism of the Catholic Church the following:

"Since Abraham, intercession—asking on behalf of another—has been characteristic of a heart attuned to God's mercy. In the age of the Church, Christian intercession participates in Christ's as an expression of the communion of

saints. In intercession, he who prays looks "not only to his own interests, but also the interests of others," even to the point of praying for those who do him harm." (CCC 2635)

In fact our intercessory prayer becomes an extension of the prayer of Jesus on behalf of us all.

My jury service officially ended on Monday. While it was certainly a time commitment that upended the parish schedule and mine, it was well worth it. Not only did it serve my own personal need for greater generosity (I like to complain to myself when things are not according to my plans), more so it served our community and helps to strengthen the fabric of civil society. For those of who have served on juries, thank you! As you may now know, this case was a murder trial. Please pray for Tina, who lost her life, her family and friends and all those involved, including the defendant, Kyle. May God's mercy and grace be upon them all.

I mentioned a few months back how we would be closing St. Bernard's Church in Volcano. This took place and we removed all of the holy items, including the altar, statues, and the massive bell in the bell tower. We listed it and recently closed escrow this past week. The funds from the sale, with guidance and

counsel from the Diocese and the Parish Finance Council, will go in two directions. First, as we are two years into an eight year loan from the Diocese for our solar panels installation at SKD, the first portion will pay off the principal so we no longer owe payments each month.

The rest of the funds will be deposited into our capital expenditures account for future major expenses in the coming years. While this was certainly a difficult step for us to make, especially considering how St. Bernard's served as a holy place for sacraments and Christian hospitality for over a century, I do believe it will help our long term financial stability and allow us to grow our mission of proclaiming the Gospel.
