Dear Friends in Christ,

So comes our last week in our month on stewardship! Hopefully there has been something that has caught your attention and invited you to reflect more on the privilege it is to be Catholic and how you are called to make a generous return to the Lord in this new year. We do hope to get your Commitment Card by the end of the month! So prayerfully consider, commit as best you can according to your present circumstances, and fill it out and send it in. Or drop it off in the drop box! And thank you for your commitment to our parish and the mission of Christ.

October also begins my favorite month of the year. Why is that? The temperature is perfect. People have settled into the school year. The colors are changing. The nights are growing slightly longer. Some of the best feast days are there too, St. Therese, the Archangels, and the Guardian Angels. And, of course, there is Halloween! Also with Fall Break for the public schools, I tend to use that as a chance to get away. So I

will be away from Oct. 12-16. There will not be public Mass those weekdays. I do not like cancelling Mass, especially with all these previous cancellations since the beginning of this pandemic. However, we all need a break once in a while and it's been a bit of a time since my last one. Know of my prayers while I am away and please keep me in yours. We still have weekend Mass of course so most of you perhaps will not even notice I am gone!

The Bishop has reminded the priests of our Diocese about preaching on the dignity of all human life during this coming month of October, which alongside being my favorite, is Respect Life Month. We will be looking at some of the major issues coursing through our present culture, including abortion, racism, euthanasia, poverty, embryonic stem cell research and the like. The goal is to take on a Christian lens, and ultimately the eyes of God, when looking at the dignity of the human person and the many threats to it that flow from original sin and the tidal wave of brokenness and evil that has followed.

On a somewhat different note altogether, the normal looks far off in the distance. And while there is a certain directive for those over 65 and with pre-existing conditions to stay at home, we also are mature enough adults to recognize for ourselves the many ways in which the fragility of the human body can be tested. For many, we can see now that there are ways to continue living, including our faith, without putting our health in unnecessary danger. So that being said, I have decided to adjust our weekday Mass schedule to allow for a weekday Mass at Our Lady of the Pines Church on Wednesdays at 11:30 AM. As well, we will have a weekday Mass at Sacred Heart on Fridays at 8:30 AM. For now, we will still have a 7 AM Mass on Wednesdays at SKD but no 7 AM Mass on Fridays at SKD. These changes will start at the beginning of October, my favorite month! We will see how this goes.
