Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This is the last weekend of our month of stewardship or what we are calling Commitment Sunday. This is your opportunity to commit to the work and mission of our parish for this coming year. No matter what we offer sacrificially, let us do it with grateful hearts.

Hopefully you were able to enjoy a couple of great events in the last couple of weeks, including the Hispanic Community Kermes and the Tri-Tip Dinner sponsored by the Knights for the Amador Pregnancy Center. Both were very successful and will support greater devotion to Our Lady and those in crisis pregnancy and their unborn children.

A number of our youth started attending Regina Caeli Academy, a classical hybrid education in the Catholic tradition. Some of them were given a writing assignment to compare how the Church is like an orchestra. I share some of their words below:

"Each player in the orchestra are the faithful ones or the people of the church. We all have an important part to play in the music. And even though the music may be challenging to play we must all do our best to play it."

"When we sin it is like losing our hold on our instruments or missing a note. This affects the whole piece, like it affects the lives of others and the Church. We are many parts, but one body."

"...when all the musicians play their parts to the best of their ability, the audience gets drawn in, and they start to accept the beauty of the Holy Spirit also."

It is a great image for stewardship, for when everyone takes their place and plays a part, the music lifts the soul to heaven. However, what happens when not everyone is willing to play or if we purposely choose to play the wrong

note? What happens when the conducting is not clear or there is confusion on what music we are trying to play?

If we are honest, these are challenging times in the Catholic Church. There seems to be confusion about basic teachings of the faith that have long stood the test of time and outlasted emperors and kingdoms desiring their destruction. So while we may have concern, let us not fall into the weariness of the world that see all things as passing. Christ and His Church and the truth of salvation the Church proclaims cannot fade away.

One of those recent confusions is surrounding the upcoming Amazonian Synod in Rome. There is a working document, that can be likened somewhat to an agenda, that appears to affirm certain notions that are contrary, either in spirit or in fact, to the Catholic faith. Here I just want to mention three.

First, the document in paragraph 19 appears to support the idea of new revelation from indigenous religions, as if they might have something to say that is missing from the Catholic faith. While Vatican Council II certainly spoke of seeds of truth in other religions, the fullness of truth is revealed in the Church that Christ established. At times there is a distorted sense of openness to teachings of other religions that people claim would somehow shed light on what Christ had already revealed. There is no need for new revelation.

Second, it appears to distort the idea of evangelization. For it emphasizes in paragraph 122 a need for intercultural dialogue but mentions no need for evangelization. As one retired Bishop from the Amazon has said, the document does not address the reality that much of the Amazon is now majority Pentecostal because of the failure of the Church to evangelize. That must be at the heart of

any renewal, here or abroad. It is good to note St. Francis never said "Preach the Gospel at all times. If necessary use words." It has been often used as if to stop us from preaching the Gospel with our words. You need words proclaimed to come to believe as St. Paul says in Romans 10:14.

Third, there is a push towards having married clergy in paragraph 129 and 138. While this is a discipline in the Church and not dogma that cannot be changed, the Church has long seen the value and spiritual depth of celibacy for the sake of the Kingdom as we see in Matthew 19:12. This is not a time to lower the standards, as if to say, this celibacy thing is no longer livable. For throughout the centuries this very way of life has born great fruit. Rather it is a time to seriously commit to discipleship and do the work of promoting vocations. We have done a less than adequate job, both here and abroad, including in the Amazon, at preparing the hearts of young people to follow Christ and making formation truly fruitful.

A number of clergy have called for prayer and fasting for this Synod and I encourage you likewise. Prayer and fasting has spiritual power, for in it we imitate our Savior, and we call upon the Father in His name. To do this authentically would be to add a fast beyond what your normal Friday fast/penance is and to add a prayer beyond what you normally are doing.

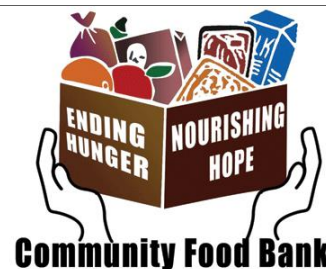
