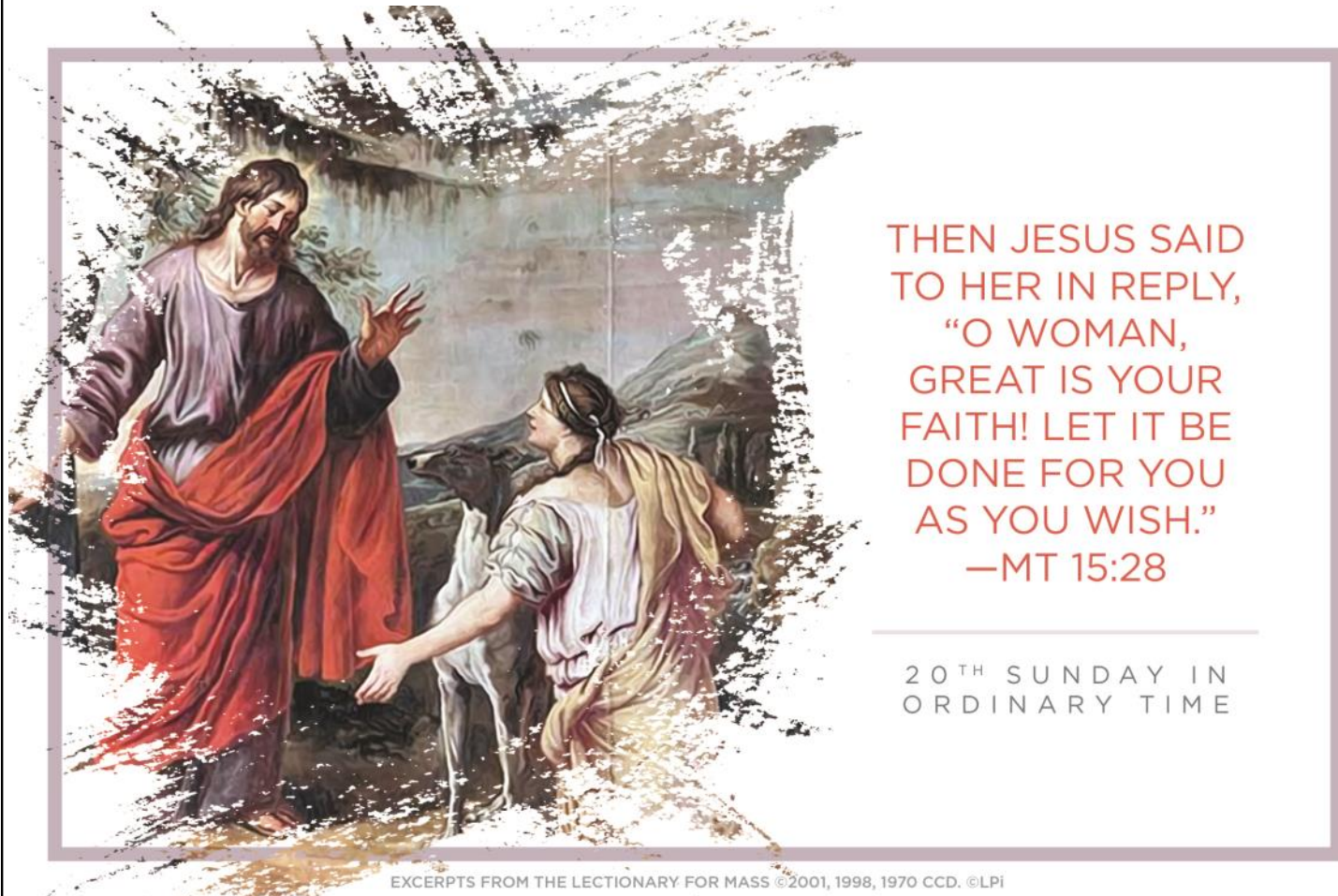

Dear Friends in Christ,

As coronavirus works its way through our population, it does fall heavy on some. I have visited two people who have died from covid and celebrated a funeral for another. Others from our parish have gotten sick, especially from their care for the elderly and infirm. The weight of all this is real. I see it firsthand. Please pray for all the sick and those who care for them and those who mourn the loss of loved ones who have died.

You may also have heard of news about Fr. Jeremy Leatherby as it has become more public. He was ordained in 2006 for our Diocese of Sacramento, the same year I went into the seminary in fact. So I know him a bit, and as with many of us young priests, looked up to him especially in his zeal and devotion as a priest. Many of us were shocked when he was suspended from ministry over four years ago for inappropriate conduct.

However, most recently, he was celebrating public Mass without faculties and not including the names of Pope Francis and our Bishop in the Eucharistic prayer. The mention of those who govern with pastoral care are signs of unity with the universal

Church. As a result of these actions, Bishop Jaime Soto wrote a letter that you can view on the diocesan website publicly excommunicating him for these actions. This is of course quite disturbing. Further troubling was that the accusation that led to his suspension has come to light in the public sphere and the nature of his actions if true are terribly horrific and scandalous, especially as one called to care for souls. While it is certainly up to the Church to decide on the guilt and render a just verdict, the whole thing must shock us.

While I do not want to get into the details of it all, you can certainly find the articles yourself online, I would just like to say three things.

First, those who represent the Church on earth are by no means perfect. At times this can be scandalous, especially when there is no repentance, from those who stand at the forefront. I do not mean to name anyone as I say that. I do think we have all seen things in these past years that lead us to ask where is the repentance and conversion that must start with those who lead us as shepherds. I only state this so that it does not discourage us. Over my years in both the seminary and as a priest, I have been saddened by the way

darkness consumes so many, including those who are ordained to different offices in the Church. But I am also constantly surprised by grace, that leads so many to conversion and back to Christ. Look then always to God's grace, which always abounds more and more.

Second, remember who we follow. We follow Jesus Christ and His Church. His Church is led by those whom He has ordained, imperfect though they (and I). We do not follow one charismatic figure or another. We follow Christ and His Church.

Third, please pray. Pray for all those who are wounded by these events and this news, that God's healing and mercy might bring reconciliation of sinners to Jesus Christ and to His Church.

Thanks to everyone who participated in our Lawnchair Chats. As a follow up to them, we are going to start engaging different members and ministries of our parish in the "The Three Conversations." The three conversations is something that comes out of The Amazing Parish movement that our parish has been a part of for the last year. The three conversations include the following:

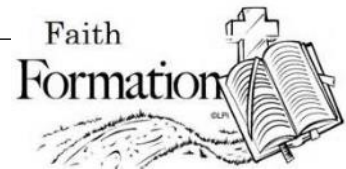
