Dear Friends in Christ,

We still have a couple projects left for the Summer. One that was just completed is replacing the windows at St. Patrick's hall with double paned ones to increase the insulation and also better secure the building. *Thanks to St. Patrick's Society for helping to cover part of the cost.* There is still the porch to be redone at St. Patrick's Rectory as well as some interior work. We are also doing a bit more work on the trim at Sacred Heart Hall so it is ready for Winter. And, lastly, we just finished upgrading our security system at SKD this past week.

We are having our 40 Hours Devotion in September. There will be an altar set up at the storage bay doors on the back side of the parish center. This will allow for people to pray from their cars, or in a chair they provide, and so, hopefully, maximize the number of people who may attend. You can signup after Mass, online, or call the parish office. We still have quite a few hours to cover so please check and see if there might be an hour you can cover.



Our **Catholics Returning Home** Sessions have begun. We have a great group. If you know anyone who could also benefit by attending, or if this speaks to you, feel free to join us on any of these next Thursdays, 9/3, 9/10/ & 9/17 at 10AM at the Parish Center. **RCIA** classes began Sunday, August 16. As we are in the period of inquiry, others who are interested are still able to join. Please get in touch with Dan Olenchuck, our Director of Evangelization and Catechesis, if you would like to attend, or have someone to invite.

September, once again, begins our month on Stewardship as we reflect on how we make use of our gifts in service of the Lord. While this is one of the few times of the year when I talk about money, it is much more than a money talk. At the heart of Christian discipleship is recognizing that God is the giver of all good gifts and to be a disciple is to put our lives into His hands. Stewardship is where the rubber hits the road. We will be sending out a mailing in the coming week that includes an update on our parish life, a calendar of this year's events, and a commitment card, so you can consider how you might commit to the active life of a parishioner this year.

In Case You Missed It

*When we fail to acknowledge as part of reality the worth of a poor person, a **human embryo**, a person with disabilities – to offer just a few examples – it becomes difficult to hear the cry of nature itself; everything is connected. (Pope Francis, On Care for Our Common Home [Laudato Si'], no. 117)*

There is much discussion about the possibility of a vaccine for Covid-19. There are moral considerations at play. Some of the vaccines currently being developed are using a human fetal kidney cell line that was taken from a baby girl who was aborted in the Netherlands in 1972. This includes Moderna, Oxford University/AstraZeneca, CanSino Biologics/Beijing Institute of Biotechnology, and Inovio Pharmaceuticals. Cell lines derived from aborted children are not necessary for vaccine development and their use is morally evil. There are others like Novavax, Sanofi Pasteur, GlaxoSmithKline (GSK), and Sinovac that are using ethically-derived cell lines. Please consider these words from the USCCB's Secretariat for Pro-Life Activities:

The only vaccines readily available in the United States for some contagious

diseases (e.g., rubella and Hepatitis A) have been manufactured using fetal tissue from induced abortions. This creates a problem of conscience for some Catholic parents.

The Moral Reflections released by the Pontifical Academy for Life in 2005 have been welcomed by the Catholic Bishops of the United States. Our Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities agrees with the National Catholics Bioethics Center, the Catholic Medical Association, and others that manufacturers should be urged to make alternative vaccines more widely available so that Catholics and others will not face this moral dilemma.

In cases where no alternative is currently available, the Academy said that Catholics may licitly accept vaccination for themselves and their children using a vaccine based on tissue from abortion or may refuse the vaccine "if it can be done without causing children, and indirectly the population as a whole, to undergo significant risks to their health." The Academy specifically cited the potential threat to pregnant women and their

unborn children from a failure to vaccinate for rubella (German measles). Risk to the public health is a factual question. Risk may vary from place to place and from one time to another in the same location; even with the same set of facts, different medical experts may come to different conclusions about the severity of the risk (or about how to weigh that against the conscientious objection of a parent). Therefore, it is not surprising that different Catholic school districts, for example, have developed different policies regarding a "conscience exemption" in such cases.

...A long-term solution lies in working to ensure that future vaccines and other medicines are not based on cooperation with practices demeaning human life. This applies to products based on abortion, as well as to projected therapies from destruction of human embryos for their stem cells.

We certainly need to advocate for ethical guidelines in the vaccine development and prudently discern how best to be faithful to God and His commandments.

RCIA Rite of Initiation of Christian Adults-Sundays 11AM at SKD

Each year on Holy Saturday during the Easter Vigil, thousands are baptized into the Catholic Church in the United States. Parishes welcome these new Catholics through the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*. RCIA is the process by which an unbaptized person, a "catechumen," and those who were baptized in another Christian denomination, called

"candidates for full communion," are prepared to become full members of the Church.

In RCIA The four periods and three steps of the RCIA are the *Period of Inquiry*, first step *Rite of Acceptance into Order of Catechumens*, *Period of Catechumenate*, second step *Rite of Election or Enrollment of Names*, *Period of Purification and*

Enlightenment, third step *Celebration of Sacraments of Initiation, Period of Postbaptismal Catechesis of Mystagogy*. We are still in the Period of Inquiry with our current catechumen and candidates.
