Dear Friends in Christ,

We had our last Mass together at St. Mary's a week ago Saturday. A special thanks to the Men's Club for hauling the altar, ambo and chairs in and out. And to Austin and Katie for their musical contribution. Thanks as well for all who joined us on a very warm Summer morning as we gave thanks to the many years the hallowed walls of St. Mary, that has been a source of refuge and strength to so many in their walk of faith.

Some time ago we had some great help cutting down a couple of the trees at Our Lady of the Pines Church. A special thanks to Supervisor Brian Oneto, Ted Novelli, Bob Strazzo, Mike Shoda, Michael Shoda, Kevin Darr, Eric, Shirley Blancett, Ray Mutter, and John Pettinichio for all their hard work. As one of them said, you do not cut down that size of tree for the firewood, but you will for a friend and neighbor. Thanks for all your hard work out there!

There is much discussion about the

possibility of a vaccine for Covid-19. There are moral considerations at play. Some of the vaccines currently being developed are using a human fetal kidney cell line that was taken from a baby girl who was aborted in the Netherlands in 1972. This includes Moderna, Oxford University/AstraZeneca, CanSino Biologics/Beijing Institute of Biotechnology, and Inovio Pharmaceuticals. Cell lines derived from aborted children are not necessary for vaccine development and their use is morally evil. There are others like Novavax, Sanofi Pasteur, GlaxoSmithKline (GSK), and Sinovac that are using ethically-derived cell lines. Please consider these words from the USCCB's Secretariat for Pro-Life Activities:

The only vaccines readily available in the United States for some contagious diseases (e.g., rubella and Hepatitis A) have been manufactured using fetal tissue from induced abortions. This creates a problem of conscience for some Catholic parents.

The Moral Reflections released by the Pontifical Academy for Life in 2005 have been welcomed by the Catholic Bishops of the United States. Our Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities agrees with the National Catholics Bioethics Center, the

Catholic Medical Association, and others that manufacturers should be urged to make alternative vaccines more widely available so that Catholics and others will not face this moral dilemma.

In cases where no alternative is currently available, the Academy said that Catholics may licitly accept vaccination for themselves and their children using a vaccine based on tissue from abortion or may refuse the vaccine "if it can be done without causing children, and indirectly the population as a whole, to undergo significant risks to their health." The Academy specifically cited the potential threat to pregnant women and their unborn children from a failure to vaccinate for rubella (German measles).

Risk to the public health is a factual question. Risk may vary from place to place and from one time to another in the same location; even with the same set of facts, different medical experts may come to different conclusions about the severity of the risk (or about how to weigh that against the conscientious objection of a parent). Therefore, it is not surprising that different Catholic school districts, for example, have developed different policies regarding a "conscience exemption" in such cases...

Remember to Keep Holy the Lord's Day

While the Bishop has continued to dispense us from the obligation to attend Mass, we are still obliged under divine law to sanctify the Lord's Day. Possible options include praying the Rosary,

reading and reflecting on the Sunday Mass readings, or watching and participating in Sunday Mass online or



on the TV. Sunday is also a day of rest, so avoid doing chores. Go for a hike. Have a BBQ. Play a board game. And rest in the Lord.

New COVID Requirements for Mass

Amador County is now on the watchlist, therefore Mass will now be held outside. We have been preparing a beautiful space in the back for Mass. We will be calling this our "Outdoor Chapel". As well, a couple of times a week when the sun is a bit directly over us, we will be having Mass in the breezeway. (Please see Mass schedule on Page 6). Following are the newest guidelines for Mass:

1. Check-in and Parking: For the Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses, we will have check-in in the breezeway. If you are able, we encourage you to park in the front of the parish center and

walk to the breezeway. If you are over 65 or otherwise need the convenience of a closer spot, pull up slowly to the breezeway and an usher will direct you through and tell you where to park.

2. Chairs: We encourage you to bring your own chairs. There will be some available for those who are unable to bring their own.

3. Shade: There is natural shade in the morning at the 8 AM Mass. At the other Masses, the solar panel shade structure provides a good amount of shade. We will also have popups available as needed.

4. Water: Please bring water.

5. Bathrooms: The parish center will be open to use the bathroom in the narthex.

7. No Limit on Attendance: There is no limit on attendance but we do encourage you to come early so we can space people appropriately.

8. Masks: We encourage everyone to wear a mask.

9. At 8 AM Mass Only: You may stay in your cars and hear the Mass. We will bring you Communion after Mass is over. Hopefully this helps some who may otherwise not feel safe coming to public Mass.

Plans are to leave from there and drive to the trailhead where the group will

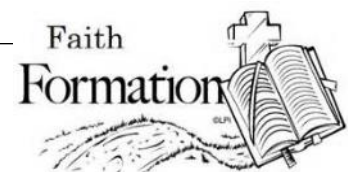
