

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This month of January marks the 48th anniversary of Roe v. Wade. This tragic court decision continues to shake the foundations of our society and leaves a question mark surrounding the question of who has the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. This also is a sensitive issue for many, especially those who have experienced the trauma of abortion or know someone who has. The Church offers great resources for those seeking healing and mercy, especially with Project Rachel counseling resources and Rachel's Vineyard Retreats.

It is striking to hear the stories of some of our young people and how they have come to see the preciousness of the gift of life, especially as they themselves or their siblings almost did not make it into this world, either because of certain health issues or a diagnosis in the womb that led to a doctor or medical care professional encouraging their parents to abort. This is perhaps the darker side of the reality of abortion. For while we are used to hearing about abortion being

promoted by organizations like Planned Parenthood, who in devious ways encourage abortion as a second form of contraception, it is harder to hear from those one should trust, considering that medical professionals should operate at least in principle under the Hippocratic oath.

As Catholics we proclaim a Gospel of Life and a Culture of Life. We believe that every human person from conception until natural death, from every ethnicity and nationality, from every age and background, from those who are disabled or sick or imprisoned, have dignity and inherent worth because they are made in God's image and likeness and therefore have certain inalienable rights that no individual decision or dictate of autocratic government or even the majority of a population can take away. It is the reason why the Catholic Church has been and continues to be the largest provider of charity throughout the world. For everyone. Born and unborn.

This month I invite you to join as a parish in praying a novena for life, using the 9 Day Novena for Life from the USCCB. You can sign up to receive the prayer & reflection by email or text at this site: www.9daysforlife.com. Pray-er beware! There is penance involved as a way to make reparation.

Also, on Friday January 22nd Bishop Soto has asked us to offer a Mass of reparation for the loss of all unborn children. This will be at 830am at Sacred Heart.

The Walk for Life in San Francisco will still take place on Saturday January 23rd. While we do not have a bus going, you are still encouraged to make the trip if you are able. As it is outside, with masks and physical distance it should be quite safe.

We have all heard of the tragedy at the Capitol this past week. Let us pray with steadfast hearts for our nation, its citizens, and for Christ to reign as the true author of peace






