

Dear Friends in Christ,

This Easter season carries us through the accounts of the Resurrection from many perspectives. At times it appears that the Gospels accounts seem to contradict. But rather, what we are seeing, is the retelling of these most momentous events of human history in the ways in which each witness and Gospel writer encountered the event. How slow or quickly did the disciples come to believe? It appears that there was much hardness of heart that needed to be broken. This is in part what we encounter. Last week I mentioned in my homily how the Gospel of John recounts this lack of belief among the apostles. This week in the Gospel of Luke it recounts that they were already believing. However what might appear as a discrepancy is perhaps in part how each remembered these events. As well, while the Scriptures describe the Apostles as unified in disbelief and belief, we know that John appeared to already come to Easter faith. While the details are important, even more important is the result - the faith that comes alive in each of their hearts. The Apostles, after the chaos of the passion and death of Jesus, encounter in these 40 days of Easter, the risen Christ and

come to believe and follow. This is what we encounter, believe, and proclaim.

Here is part of the text of Pope Francis' *Urbi et Orbi* message, delivered April 12th, 2020, at the Basilica of St. Peter:

"Today the Church's proclamation echoes throughout the world: "Jesus Christ is risen!" – "He is truly risen."

"Like a new flame this Good News springs up in the night: the night of a world already faced with epochal challenges and now oppressed by a pandemic severely testing our whole human family. In this night, the Church's voice rings out: "Christ, my hope, is risen!"

May the Lord of life welcome the departed into his kingdom and grar comfort and hope to those still suffer-

"This is a different "contagion," a message transmitted from heart to heart – for every human heart awaits this Good News. It is the contagion of hope: "Christ, my hope, is risen!" This is no magic formula that makes problems vanish. No, the resurrection of Christ is not that. Instead, it is the victory of love over the root of evil, a victory that does not "by-pass" suffering and death, but passes through them, opening a path in the abyss, transforming evil into good: this is the unique hallmark of the power of God.

"The Risen Lord is also the Crucified One, not someone else. In his glorious body he bears indelible wounds: wounds that have become windows of hope. Let us turn our gaze to him that he may heal the wounds of an afflicted humanity.

"Today my thoughts turn in the first place to the many who have been directly affected by the coronavirus: the sick, those who have died and family members who mourn the loss of their loved ones, to whom, in some cases, they were unable even to bid a final the departed into his kingdom and grant comfort and hope to those still suffering, especially the elderly and those who are alone. May he never withdraw his consolation and help from those who are especially vulnerable, such as persons who work in nursing homes, or live in barracks and prisons. For many, this is an Easter of solitude lived amid the sorrow and hardship that the pandemic is causing, from physical suffering to economic difficulties.

"This disease has not only deprived us of human closeness, but also of the possibility of receiving in person the consolation that flows from the sacraments, particularly the Eucharist and

What To Do on the Lord's Day

Those who will not attend Sunday Mass should prayerfully unite themselves to the Lord through other appropriate means. Below are three ways:

- 1. Reflect on the Sunday Mass readings, which you can find on the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, usccb.org/readings. Magnificat has also made their online version free to access. It includes the readings, reflections, and prayers in this Lenten season, https:// us.magnificat.net/free.
- 2. Watch live coverage of the Holy Mass. For those with access to the **Eternal Word Television Network** (EWTN), you can watch live daily Masses through their TV channel. We

also stream our Sunday 9:30 AM Mass at SKD on our Facebook page, facebook.com/stkatharinedrexelamador, as well as 1340 AM and 96.5 FM. You may also listen to the Sunday homilies, which are available at *soundcloud.com/* frcolinwen or our parish website, www.stkatharinedrexel.com.

3. Most importantly, all Catholics unable to attend Mass should make a spiritual communion. If you cannot receive the Blessed Sacrament at Mass, the ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Sacrament allows you to partake in its effects. In other words, although you do not receive the Eucharist physically, you can still receive the graces that flow from the Eucharist. Although we obtain

more graces when we eat His Body and drink His Blood as He commanded, a spiritual communion still produces a partial participation in the effects of the Sacrament. Here is a brief Act of Spiritual Communion which you can learn and then pray whenever unable to receive the Eucharist:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Prayer: Regina Caeli (O Queen of Heaven)

During Eastertide (Easter Sunday through Pentecost), the Regina Caeli is prayed in place of The Angelus.

Queen of Heaven

- **V.** Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia. R. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia.
- V. Has risen, as he said, alleluia.
- R. Pray for us to God, alleluia.
- V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.
- **R.** For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia. Let us pray. O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the inter-

cession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.


