



Dear Friends in Christ,

It has been a strange last couple of weeks as we pass through the light and darkness of these power outages. While it has certainly been a frustration and a trial for many of us, it is striking as well that it happens as we approach the end of our liturgical year and the readings slowly start to turn more apocalyptic, as we draw near to the Solemnity of Christ the King. Perhaps the end will come just like a blackout. There will be little time to prepare. That is why we are invited to prepare now and not put off until tomorrow what needs to be done today.

Thanks to all those who have responded to help plan our first Christmas Brunch or what I am calling our "Light the Way to Christmas Brunch." If you still want to help, contact Marge in the Parish Office. We'll need help with decorations, setup, serving, cooking, and even a kids station with a bounce house. Should be quite the event. We are also planning a float for the Light Parade in Sutter Creek. We have a call out for a long trailer as well as a generator for the day of. Considering how many Lowes is selling these days, there has to be one out there to loan out by December 14th, I hope! We'll also need some of our young people to ride with the float so consider joining us that evening and representing our parish.

November is a month where I often discuss Catholic Funeral Planning. However today it seems opportune to mention a little about end-of-life care as there seems to be some uncertainty about Catholic teaching on this. The Catechism of the Catholic Church is quite clear in paragraphs 2277-2279:

"Whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists of putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick, or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable.

Thus an act or omission which, of itself or by intention, causes death in order to eliminate suffering constitutes a murder gravely contrary to the dignity of the human person and to the respect due to the living God, his Creator. The error of judgment into which one can fall in good faith does not change the nature of this murderous act, which must always be forbidden and excluded.

Discontinuing medical procedures that are burdensome, dangerous, extraordinary, or disproportionate to the expected outcome can be legitimate; it is the refusal of "over-zealous" treatment. Here one does not will to cause death; one's inability to impede it is merely accepted. The decisions should be made by the patient if he is competent and able or, if not, by those legally entitled to act for the patient, whose reasonable will and legitimate interests must always be respected.

Even if death is thought imminent, the ordinary care owed to a sick person cannot be legitimately interrupted. The use of painkillers to alleviate the sufferings of the dying, even at the risk of shortening their days, can be morally in conformity with human dignity if death is not willed as either an end or a means, but only foreseen and tolerated as inevitable. Palliative care is a special form of disinterested charity. As such it should be encouraged."

If you have any specific questions feel free to set up a time to speak with me.

This month we will look more deeply into the liturgy we celebrate, especially on the first three Sundays. It will be a chance to reflect on what is familiar to many but foreign to most.

We also start our Marian consecration this Tuesday Nov. 5th. Please join us in reflection and prayer each day. If you miss a day don't worry. Just keep going!

Lastly, thanks for your prayers as our staff and I traveled to Anaheim for *The Amazing Parish Conference*. It was a great blessing and source of renewal. Let us see what God has in store.


