

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Easter mailing went out this past week so hopefully you received something in the mail. If not, that is a sign we either have your incorrect mailing address or you are not registered. Either way, if this is the case, please reach out to Liz or Alex at the Parish Office. We only send a couple mailings a year so it is always a good idea to have the correct address on file.

This coming week we enter into the most holy week of the year or literally, Holy Week. It begins with what we often call Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday. Here we recount both the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem as the crowds lay palms before him as well as his passion and death. These are striking moments. There is no need for a word to be preached for the events and words themselves should speak to any human heart who longs for God but knows we have failed to open our hearts to Him. Let these most holy days of our Christian calendar and liturgical year touch your heart, break down the obstacles holding back His grace, and so make this coming week one of encounter and conversion.

Sr. Nadia recently shared with me the devastation that has taken place in the northern part of Ethiopia in the Tigray region, where a civil war, and the ensu-

ing lawlessness and deprivation, have left many close to starvation and certain death. She was able to visit there as part of Conference of Major Religious Superiors (CMRS). Here are some of her words below:

Visiting St. Ann's sisters

They were very thankful for our presence among them. They were in Adagamus when the war began. Property was stolen. One sister was hidden for many days in a cave with other people without having anything. She saw a lady with a new born baby who was asked by the soldiers is this child a boy or a girl? She responded - a boy. They told her to take him down from her back and they shot him in front of the mother. A short time later, the mother died due to the shock. This sister is still quite stressed and suffering from depression.

Visiting the camp called....

A school is used for the 3,900 people who have come from Sasse, Sebatha and Alithena sides, as refugees, to hide themselves in order to save their lives. In this camp there is very little outside humanitarian help. People are without food, water, clothes, medicine, and light. In one small room 110 people are sleeping on the floor. There are only two bathrooms for 3,900. Young girls are being abused

by the boys.

Visiting Vwkro- diocesan priests.

They were also grateful to CMRS for the solidarity visit. Four cars were taken away by the soldiers; 12 computers and PCIO, windows and doors were broken. One priest went into one of the caves to escape for 10 days. There was no water, gas, medicine, or light. Animals died or were stolen. Pregnant ladies gave birth on the road; girls were abused.

Visiting Adigrat Missionaries of African fathers also known as the white fathers

They felt isolated, but were very grateful to CMRS for paying this visit to them. They also had a very bad experience during the war. Fr. Jeri, who is from Ireland, cried while sharing his experiences. Vehicles and computers, and other personal property in the house were stolen. Two priests (one foreigner and one local), were told by a group of soldiers who entered their house, to drive their two cars to Asmara in Eritrea loaded with possessions from their house. People are suffering from not having communication with others for such a long time. The priest was crying, out of despair, due to their hard experience and still living it - because it is not over yet.


