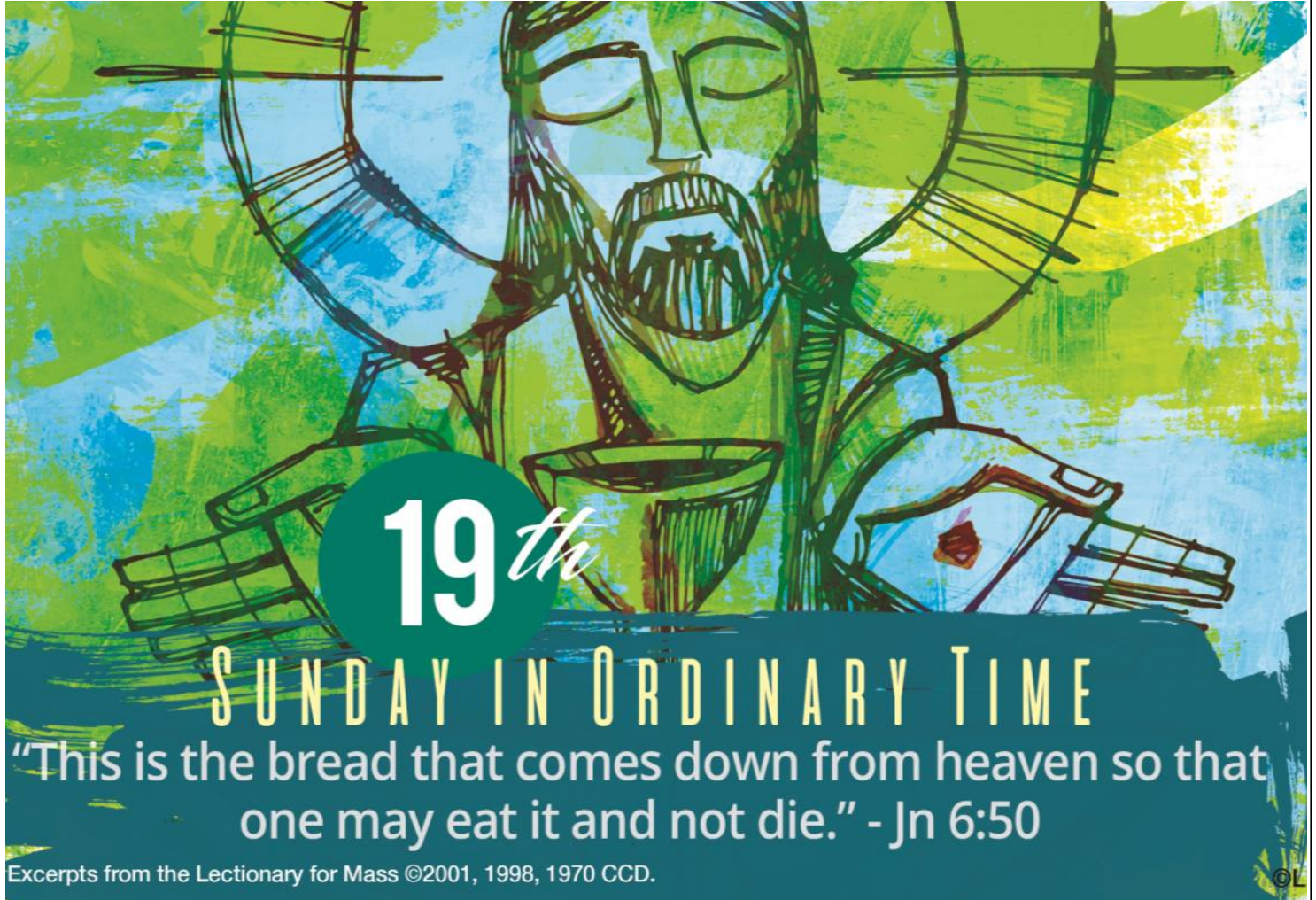

Dear Friends in Christ,

This week let us return to the book "From Christendom to Apostolic Mission" that I have now mentioned a few times and that we used for our Lawn Chair Chats. Many missed out on our discussions but I did not want you to miss out on some of this material. This text presents two very different narratives for the modern world. They are based on this idea of assumed first principles, that as we inhabit different cultural environments, we take on the values, whether true or false, unless we actively resist or intend one way or another. The first is the Christian one. The second, the false one, goes like this. It presumes a reality not based in fact or science but a romantic utopianism.

1. Rather than a heavenly vision oriented upward towards God and the culmination with eternal glory, the new vision was a plainly earthly one where we could achieve perfection here by our own human innovation. So that as the world progressed technologically and scientifically, it would also progress socially and morally. Simply put, we were better than our ancestors by being born later. This led to the dismissal of previous moral codes or spiritual practices as old fashioned or no longer needed. As well, it led to impatience with imperfection. While the Christian vision has always recognized the call to love neighbor, especially the poor, sick and aged, this utopian ideal did as well, but with a twist. For it is not so much out of a de-

sire to love our neighbor as a hatred towards and a desire to eradicate poverty and disease and ravages of age. And when this was realized as impossible, the real turn happened. Perfect became the need to eliminate poverty by eliminating the poor altogether (think forced sterilization), eliminating or aborting the diseased and disabled, and euthanizing the elderly. The desire for justice and care for others no longer rooted in heavenly truth became and still so often is incredibly horrific to human dignity.

2. The second premise of this vision is the denial of the fall. Whereas the Christian understanding is that the world is broken because we are broken, this new way proclaims that man is already perfect and only the elimination of ignorance will bring about perfection on earth. The problem here is not only that ignorance is selective, but that it is not sufficient. Rather there is always a scapegoat for the persistence of evil, some group that is halting true progress. Of old it was revealed in events like the Reign of Terror, the Cultural Revolution, the Gulag, and the Holocaust. Or even more recently with abortion mills or the terror raged on Muslims in China.

3. The third is that God is marginalized. It is not necessarily a statement that God does not exist but that God does not matter, which is practically speaking, the same thing. The proposal is that one can then define their existence, choose friends, find a career, marry,

obtain justice and truth, and right and wrong all without reference to God. Religion is a private matter and one can certainly be religious as long as it is the modern version, one that does not require anything of you but only helps you to deal with the stress of existence. And anyone claiming that religion holds a universal truth for all people everywhere is an extremist. The only fair statement is "do whatever works for you". The result is a world filled with boredom that must find ways to distract itself from a nonsensical and dull existence.

What a crazy vision of the world except that most have come to believe it, even many Catholics!

There are three more premises I will cover next week as well as the proper Christian vision, already perhaps hinted at here and written hopefully upon your heart as well.
