

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. We recall that what we celebrate each Sunday is not simply a remembrance or a sign of love or a gathering of like minded believers in one spirit, but the making present of the same saving sacrifice of Jesus Christ from 2,000 years ago. The bread that is broken and the wine that is poured out becomes through the blessing of the priest, the very Body and Blood of Christ. There is a well known nondenomination type pastor who once said he was amazed that for 1500 years all Christians believed this. It was only at selves offended that they are unable to the Protestant Reformation that something was fractured. Sadly, this break led fellowship denied to someone for some to such terrible consequences for all, both in the wars that ensued but more so in the divisions that were wrought and how many no longer know of this great gift of the Eucharist given by Jesus to us. That should cause us profound sadness.

But we too, as Catholics, often do not understand the great mystery before us. the Eucharist was just another spiritual We too can make it more of a casual encounter, especially by our own preparation for Mass, both physically and spiritually, in how we dress or fail to fast the Scriptures does Jesus say unless you before Mass or how we prepare our hearts with openness to God's grace. No wonder perhaps so many do not believe

when we do not act like we believe. This Blood, which all the Church Fathers are idea of preparation is not meant to make our faith a showy religion, which is only an exterior manifestation of piety but rather one that is both interior and exterior, as the body and soul are bound together and share a common destiny. It is noted in fact, and obviously we include Catholics who do not come to Mass every Sunday, that the majority of Catholics do not believe or appear to understand the teaching about the Real Presence, that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist.

No wonder then people, both Catholic and non-Catholic alike, can find themreceive, for they see it as mere table medieval moral standards that few seem able or willing to follow. The Eucharist is seen simply as a sign of Jesus and nothing more. And those who do perhaps recognize their need to abstain on one Sunday or for a while from the Eucharist seem in no rush to go to Confession or reconcile their lives while their salvation hangs in the balance, as if option alongside hiking in the woods or praying a rosary. Nothing could be further from the truth! For where else in do this you have no life in me? It was never for simple bread and wine that Jesus referred to but His Body and

unanimous in proclaiming in the early life of the Church.

We need Jesus and we need the Eucharist! Nothing less will suffice. But we also need to be spiritually prepared. Our casual reception of the Eucharist not only provides no grace for us but in fact heaps more coals upon our head as we take for granted the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist, St. Paul makes that clear in his First Letter to the Corinthians in Chapter 11. What then must we do, as those early converts to Christianity asked? We need to repent, to change our lives, and believe in the Gospel, believe in the sense of submitting to the way of Jesus Christ, the sequela Christi.
